BENGALURU:On Tuesday, the Wildlife Awareness and Conservation Club (WACC) of St Joseph's University(SJU) organised a human chain as part of Neerathon, their annual marathon for water conservation.

Students from across the campus, along with the vice chancellor and public relations officer of the university, participated in the event. They formed a human chain and passed a bucket along the chain, with each person adding water to it.


"We have to conserve water because water levels in Bengaluru are going down and water is the source of life, thus if you raise awareness and save water, humanity will benefit," he added.

MSMEs push to fuel Modi's \$10 trillion vision

n the Union Budget 2024-25, one of the prime focuses of the Narendra Modi government was boosting the micro, small, and medium enterprises, along with youth, and women-led enterprises. With a target of Rs 11.1 lakh crore in the fiscal year (FY) 2025, this would become 3.4% of the Gross Domestic Product (GDP), in turn advocating infrastructure said the development, PM. Here's a look at the current status of the MSME sector and what lies ahead.

According to the Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises Annual Report 2022-23 India has approximately 6.3 crore MSMEs. As of December 2023, the highest registrations were recorded in five states: recorded Maharashtra 37.12 lakhs, followed by Registration online system,

Tamil Nadu with 21.74 lakhs, Uttar Pradesh with 20.28 lakhs, Gujarat with 15.53 lakhs, and Rajasthan with 15.57 lakhs.

The Majority (72%) of the registered MSMEs, as of December 31, 2022, were service enterprises, while manufacturing covered 28%. In July 2020, the Union MSME Ministry launched the new MSME/Udvam

MSMEs until May 2023.

In a 2023 report by the Annual Survey of Industries (ASI), the years 2021-22 recorded a sharp growth essential economic parameters, including, capital, input, output, Gross Value Added (GVA), net income, and profit. The main contributors to this

which saw a registration of like the manufacture of approximately 16.2 million basic metals, coke & refined petroleum products, pharmaceuticals, motor vehicles, food products, etc. Together, these industries have contributed about 56% of the total GVA of the sector. It also showed a growth rate of 34.3% and output growth of 37.5% which is exponential growth when compared to the postgrowth were industries Covid period in 2020-21

where the growth was only 8.8%. It was primarily due to a 4.1% drop in inputs.

The MSME Annual Report 2022-23 suggests that to aid present and prospective entrepreneurs, government announced new composite classification for manufacturing and service units, removing differences between these two sectors.

As per the Economic Survey 2022-23, the MSME sector in India contributed to approximately 30.6 % of the year's GDP, employing more than 11 crore people, and the aim is to grow this number to 15 crore in the coming years.

With the government now taking initiatives to aid the development of MSMEs and their inherent potential to grow, MSMEs could be a vital cog in the government's aspiration to make the country a 10 trillion dollar economy.

PM unveils road map for progress of J&K with 32,000 Cr

s part of the ongoing Viksit Bharat Sankalp Yatra, PM Modi on Tuesday announced a comprehensive investment plan of Rs 32,000 crores for the multi-sectoral development of Jammu and Kashmir from the Maulana Azad Stadium.

This investment plan is aimed at improving infrastructure, transportation, healthcare, education, and aviation thereby transforming the region into an economic hub and a prime tourist destination, added PM Modi.

PM Modi criticised Congress for hindering the territory's development with dynasty politics and a lack of welfare reforms.

He hailed the removal of Article 370 as a crucial step to fuel the development of the region. Vowing to address the alienation of youth, PM Modi stressed the mantra of "Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas, Sabka Vishwas, and Sabka Prayas" for Jammu and Kashmir's development. He also cited minority reservations

for Paddari, Pahari, Gadda Brahmans and Koli minority groups and welfare schemes for women as achievements so far.

In addition to appointing over 1500 government recruits, PM Modi flagged off newly electrified railway lines on the Banihal-Khari-Sumber-Sangaldan route costing ₹15,863 crore and the

Baramulla-Srinagar-Banihal-Sangaldan route ₹470.23 crore. Former CM Farooq Abdullah praised the new rail network's potential to benefit local trade by solving snow-related road blockages and delays in connectivity.

PM Modi also inaugurated educational institutions like IIT Jammu, IIM Jammu, and AIIMS Vijaypur, aiming to strengthen education and healthcare in the region. While laying down the foundation of a new terminal at Jammu airport, the PM envisioned a boost in Kashmir's tourism industry and said that tourists would prefer travelling to Kashmir over Switzerland shortly.

Ex-BJP VPs now on BEL board

Tour out of the seven currently presiding independent directors appointed by the Ministry of Defence at the Bharat Electronics Ltd were previously associated with BJP, revealed an RTI query on Tuesday. Bose, an RTI activist received a reply from BEL confirming the names of the directors. BEL is a public sector enterprise under the Union government and is also tasked with manufacturing and supplying electronic voting machines (EVM). The four members with former affiliations to BJP include Dr Podala Venkata the former BJP vice president Andhra Pradesh, KM Shamjibhai the former BJP President of Rajkot Gujarat, Dr Shivnath Yadav the former BJP vice president of Uttar Pradesh and Mrs Shyama Singh the former BJP vice president of Bihar.

"It raises doubts on the electoral process. whole Election Commission India should immediately remove them," said Bose.
